## Feast Day: Saint Luke the Evangelist



Luke wrote the third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles. In these two books, he shows the parallel between the life of Christ and that of the Church. He was the only Gentile Christian among the Gospel writers. Tradition holds him to be a native of Antioch,

and Paul calls him "our beloved physician."

St. Luke's Gospel emphasizes mercy, universal salvation, the poor, renunciation of the world, prayer, and joy. He reveals his expertise in classic Greek style as well as his knowledge of Jewish sources. There is a warmth to Luke's writing that sets it apart from that of the other synoptic Gospels, and yet it beautifully complements those works.

Luke appears in Acts during Paul's second journey, remains at Philippi during his third journey, and accompanies him to Jerusalem. During the two years of Paul's imprisonment, Luke had time to research and interview people who had known Jesus. He accompanied Paul on the dangerous journey to Rome where he was a faithful companion. Luke is the patron saint of artists, physicians, and surgeons.
