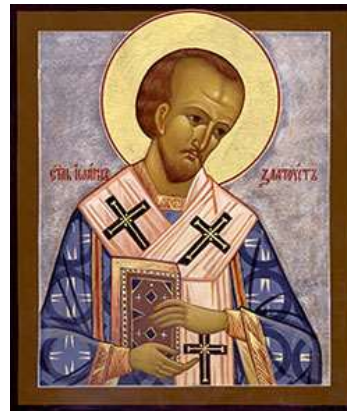
Upcoming Events and Reminders

St. John Chrysostom

John as born in 347 to a Christian mother. As John became older he began to become more deeply committed to Christianity and studied



theology under Diodore of Tarsus in Antioch. In 386 in Antioch he was ordained a priest. John became vastly popular in Antioch for his public speaking, known as “golden-mouthed” for his eloquence. In 397, John was appointed archbishop of Constantinople. John did

have some enemies in high places. One being Theophilus of Alexandria and another empress Eudoxia. Conflict with these leaders resulted in John being exiled. His enemies were not satisfied with his sufferings, and banished him further to Pythius. John died on his way there on September 14, 407. St. John Chrysostom is known as a Doctor of the Church. His feast day is September 13.
