- We are in need of donations of bottled water for the students. Any donations are appreciated!

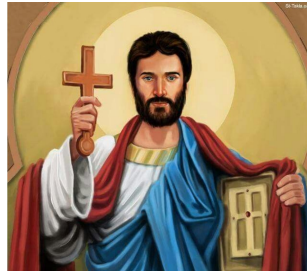

St. Timothy



Timothy was Christian born at Lystra, Lycaenia to a Greek father and a Jewish mother. He met St. Paul in Lystra and became his disciple. They were close friends and preached together. Timothy accompanied Paul on his second missionary trip. The journey was cut short and Timothy was sent to Thessalonica to report on the Christians under persecution Timothy continued to accompany Paul on missionary work. He was most likely with Paul when he was imprisoned by Rome. St. Paul wrote multiple letters to Timothy during this time. Timothy they traveled to Ephesus, where he became its first bishop. He died in Ephesus for opposing a pagan festival. St. Timothy is the patron saint of stomach disorders. As he was known to have suffered from them. He was a disciple of St. Paul and is also credited co-author to several books in the New Testament. His feast day is January 26th.
