St. Peter Regulatus



St. Peter Regulatus, also known as Peter Regalado, Franciscan reformer. Was born in Valladolid, Spain in 1390. He entered into the Franciscan Order at age 13. He was one of the first disciples of Pedro de Villacreces. After the death of Pedro, Peter became superior at the monastery Tribulos de Abroyo in 1422. He became known for his asceticism, ability to levitate, his gift of miracles, prophecy, and charity to the poor. St. Peter became the head of all the Franciscan Spanish reform groups, focusing on reforms of his monastery, and promoting reform in the other Franciscan houses. After his death, in La Aguilera in 1456, his grave became a pilgrimage. Queen Isabella the Catholic, exhumed his body 36 years after his death to find it incorrupt. St. Peter was then placed in a more precious tomb in the church in La Aguilera. St. Peter Regulatus was canonized by Pope Benedict XIV on June 29, 1746. His feast day is March 30th.
