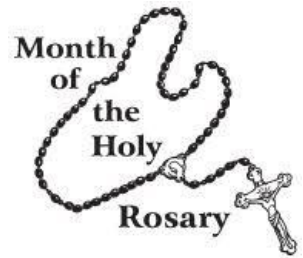

Saint Quentin



Saint Quentin was a Roman full of zeal for the Kingdom of Jesus Christ. He went with eleven others sent from Rome. They separated to evangelize the various regions of France. Quentin remained at Amiens and endeavored by his constant prayers, preaching, and labors to make that region part of Our Lord's inheritance.

He healed in the name of Our Lord, simply by the sign of the Cross.

He could not escape the notice of Rictiovarus, the Roman prosecutor who represented Emperor Maximian. Quentin was seized at Amiens and thrown into prison. Found to be invulnerable to either promises or threats, the prosecutor condemned him to the most barbarous torture. An angel released the prisoner during the night, telling him to go and preach. Quentin's guardians discovered that he had disappeared, though all doors were barred, and found him in the city preaching on the Apostles' Creed. They were converted. Rictiovarus was furious.

Brought back before the tribunal as a sorcerer, St. Quentin said: "If by persevering in my faith, I am put to death by you, I will not cease to live in Jesus Christ; this is my hope, I maintain it with confidence." He was again tortured. Finally, this glorious martyr was decapitated while praising God. He died in 287 and is honored in France.
